







"People kill over money and power and love, but no one kills over gnomes."

Operation Pastorius

On the night of **12 June 1942**, the first submarine to arrive in the U.S., U-202, landed at Amagansett, New York, about 100 miles east of New York City on Long Island, at what is now Atlantic Avenue beach, depositing English-speaking Nazi saboteurs!







The Nazis were quickly caught and rounded up. Tried and covicted, six were swiftly hanged. The rest of the group got long prison sentences.







A civilian home front procession held supporting the World War II mobilization effort, the largest parade ever held in New York City, with up to 500,000 marching up Fifth Avenue (from Washington Square Park to 79th Street) and 2,500,000 spectators in attendance.

But in Kerhonkson, "Happy days are here again"!


Every man had a job if he wanted one. The trains were running again. Kerhonkson (On the Rondout) was back on the map like back in the days of the D&H Canal!












"But not the USS Kerhonkson!



"Built for the US Government and launched on 4 December 1919 for completion during March 1920.

"Kerhonkson served for almost two decades before she was sold to Japan in 1938 and renamed Ryuzan Maru. She became a Japanese army cargo vessel and as such, on 31 July 1943, was torpedoed and sunk in the Java Sea by a US submarine."








"New York factories produced thousands upon thousands of airplanes, "Air Supremacy", Long Island style!"

"And the dreaded **Trolls**, kept at bay for more than two centuries?"



































THOMAS DEWEY GOVERNOR OF NEW YORK 1943-1954

Thomas E. Dewey was elected as the 47th Governor of New York. And the only NY Governor to run for presidency *twice*. And lose both times.













Dewey helped to establish the State University system and increased unemployment and disability benefits. Most important, he pushed the New York State Thruway, the highway that would open the Rondout Valley and the rest of the state.





Jews "assimilating" New York Style. Post-WWII, hundreds of thousands of Jews, many of them Holocaust survivors went through Ellis Island and landed in NYC.





As the new New Yorkers began to prosper, they longed to be away from the sweltering summers. North of the city, Jewish-owned farms began taking in summertime boarders to make ends meet. That small, simple business model soon created a sprawling constellation of all-inclusive resorts, hotels and more modest bungalow colonies and *kuchalayns* – establishments with shared kitchens.









The Jewish Alps offered it all! Each hotel had modern amenities, including beauty salons and barber shops, as well as countless avenues for summer recreation. Tennis, rowing, bocce ball, scenic hikes, ballroom dancing – there were more than enough activities to fill any July day.



At night came the comedy. These were the days for that unique Jewish humor! Big-time comics cut their teeth and made their bones in the Catskills.

In NYC, from down South, music traveled up North, and evolved as it went.

















"From our very beginnings – You must know more NY History than all its governors put together!"












The impact of the new Boeing 707: Rather than drive 2 hours on the Thruway to get to the Catskills, on could sit back and relax on a jet and fly to Miami!

"You turned New York into a superpower, Guv-nerr! From our treasured State, these newfangled jets, loaded with mushroom bombs can fly off and destroy the world!"









The game did not go well for the hometown Giants who were beaten in overtime. And it was on national television!

Harriman did no better in the 1958 election. He then sought the presidential nomination at the 1952 and 1956 Democratic National Conventions only to lose out to Adlai Stevenson twice who then lost twice to Eisenhower.

Harriman's socially progressive agenda included advancement in consumer protection and services for the mentally ill and elderly. And he made **BINGO** *legal*!
